

GUIDELINES FOR ABSTRACT SUBMISSION

SUBMISSION DEADLINE: April 1, 2026 to August 30, 2026

I- SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Authors must carefully read these guidelines and complete all required fields in the submission form. Failure to comply with these guidelines will result in the disqualification of the submission.

- Abstracts must be submitted exclusively through the website imar.ufv.br by August 30, 2026.
- Each abstract may be submitted only once by a single author. There is no limit to the number of abstracts that each registered participant may submit.
- During submission, all authors must be entered in the desired order, with a maximum of 10 authors per abstract.
- The presenting author must be designated during submission and identified with an asterisk (*) in the "Author(s)" field of the submission form. The presenting author must be included in the list of authors, be registered for the event, and have completed the registration payment. If the designated presenting author is unable to attend, another co-author may present the work, provided that they are also included in the list of authors, are registered for the event, and have completed the registration payment.
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II- FORMATTING AND CONTENT GUIDELINES

- Abstracts must be written and submitted in English.
- The abstract text must not exceed 3,000 characters, including spaces. The complete abstract, including the title, authors, affiliations, abstract text, and references (if provided), must fit within one A4 page. Authors are strongly encouraged to prepare the abstract in Microsoft Word to verify compliance with this page limit before submission. After verification, the text should be copied into the submission system.
- The title must be clear, concise, accurately reflect the content of the study, and contain no more than 20 words.
- The abstract should include only relevant information, covering the background of the study, methodology, results, and conclusions, highlighting the scientific contribution and potential applications of the work.

- Figures, graphs and tables are not allowed.
- The abstract must present results and conclusions supported by the data obtained. Abstracts containing statements such as "results will be presented" or "data will be analyzed" will not be accepted. For ongoing studies, preliminary results must be included.
- The body of the abstract must not contain the names of the authors, their affiliations, or any information that could identify the authors or their institutions. Author names and affiliations must be provided exclusively in the "Author(s)" field of the submission form.
- Formulas, equations, symbols, abbreviations, and units of measurement must comply with international scientific writing standards and, where applicable, the International System of Units (SI).
- References are optional and must be entered in the designated section of the submission form.
- The abstract must include three keywords, listed in alphabetical order and separated by commas.
- Case reports that lack scientific originality or relevance will not be accepted.
- Narrative literature reviews are not accepted.
- Commercial or trade names should be avoided unless their use is essential. Whenever possible, generic names of active ingredients or chemical compounds should be used.
- Information regarding funding agencies, approval by the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) or equivalent Ethics Committee, when applicable, must be included at the end of the abstract in a separate paragraph.
- Acknowledgments should be included only when strictly necessary.
